

#### 1.FIRST TIME IN PRAGUE

Standard tour including the most important landmarks of Prague, last about 4-5 hours.

Strahov Monastery, Loreta, Hradčany - courtyard, Prague Castle, St. Vitus Cathedral,

Fruit's market, University, Wenceslas Square



## 2. THE MOST IMPORTANT LANDMARKS

Programme for 1, 2 or several d ays, depending on client's wish. Standard tour around Prague can be extended by visiting chosen sites. More detailed tour may be guided through less visited, but equally attractive routes, including for example Wallenstein Garden, Jewish Quarter (Josefov), Žižkov Television Tower, Last about 12 hours.

Example of sightseeing tour: Day 1 (around 5 h) Vyšehrad, The Wilsonova Building at the Main Train Station, State Opera, Wenceslas Square, Lucerna, Franciscan Garden, Na Přikope Street, Municipal House, Fruit's market, Charles University, Ungelt Courtyard, Old Town Square

Day 2 (around 7 h) Strahov Monastery, Loreta, Hradčany - courtyard, The Royal Gardens, Prague Castle (with entrance to: St. Vitus Cathedral, St. George's Basilica, Royal Palace Golden Lane), Malá Strana, Charles Bridge, Old **Town Square** 

### 3. PRAGUE FOR PILGRIMS

The program is prepared for first day in Prague, second day with the possibility of tour to Olomouc, Příbram. The program includes entry to selected objects, the possibility of enrichment with other attractions.



Example of sightseeing tour:

Famous Infant Jesus of Prague - Bambini di Praga, Břevnov - the oldest male monastery, The Loreta Marian Sanctuary, The Church of Our Lady before Týn. Outside Prague: Příbram - the holy mountain, The Holly Hill near Olomouc, Kutná Hora - Church of St. Barbara.

# 4. DAVID ČERNY TRAIL

It's the route along the sculptures and installations of the controversial artist, the author of crawling infants attached to the Žižkov Television Tower and London Booster. In 2009 he created a work of art, which was supposed to "celebrate" Czech's EU Council presidency.

Černy's work titled Entropa was presented in Brussels. It brought up mixed feelings and it offended citizens of many European countries.

# 5. ARCHITECTURAL PEARLS TRAIL

Dancing House, cubistic townhouses, modern Baba Housing Estate, Art Nouveau Municipal House, Villa Müller and many more. Czech's Prague is a mixture of architecture from the past and new projects. On both sides



of the Vltava we may come across architectural pearls from different epochs.

#### 6. BEER PRAGUE

The Czechs are the biggest beer lovers in the whole world. You may find out why after drinking Czech beer, on the next day you don't have to worry about a headache. The trip along the trail of the best and the oldest beer pubs, including for example *U Fleků* – the oldest brewery, which has been working uninterrupted from 1499, and a trip to Strahov Monastic Brewery and Museum of beer.

### 7. PRAGUE BY NIGHT

A trip through Prague at night, which astonishes with its beautiful views over the city. but also magic and mystery surrounding this place Boat trip on the Vltava and dinner in the Czech style with live music are additional options.



### 8. PRAGUE FOR THE YOUNGEST

Standard trip through Prague in slightly less casual and more playful form. We may also visit museums that are dedicated to children and teenagers (Museum of Toys, Petrin, Charles Bridge, Museum of Technology, Lego Museum, Mirror Maze and Distorted Mirrors Hall).

Visit the city which is full of wonderful ideas for Christmas presents, and feel the traditional Slavic Christmas spirit.
